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My name is Joseph Spires, and I am a local bankruptcy attorney. If the local paper contains an announcement that your mortgage company intends to foreclose on your property or if you have received notification directly from your mortgage company, filing bankruptcy is an option to stopping the foreclosure.

In short, federal bankruptcy law can stop the foreclosure provided you act in time. A Chapter 13 Bankruptcy would allow you to put all the back due payments of the mortgage inside a Chapter 13 Plan. The Chapter 13 Plan would allow you to pay the back due payments over time. You would not have to come up with a lump sum payment to catch up the back due mortgage payments. Additionally, you can put other bills inside the same Chapter 13 Plan. These bills could include, but are not limited to, car and truck payments, boat payments, motor cycle payments, medical expenses, furniture payments, credit cards, finance companies, check advances, and taxes.
